**Overview:** A roundtable discussion on how to navigate, manage and confront issues arising from the improper or unhealthy fraternization between members of the prosecution team and judges.

**Bio:** William Lee Hon grew up in East Texas and spent over 25 years seeking justice for the people of Polk County and East Texas. He is a graduate of Livingston High School and received his Bachelor of Science Degree from Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas. He attended the University of Mississippi Law School in Oxford, Mississippi graduating in 1990. During law school Lee served with distinction on the editorial staff of the University of Mississippi Law Journal and as a member of the 1990 University of Mississippi National Trial Competition Team.

Following law school Lee worked with the prestigious Campbell, Delong Law Firm in Greenville, Mississippi—the oldest continuing law partnership in that state—and practiced general civil litigation, personal injury defense, banking and bankruptcy litigation.

In 1994 Lee returned to his native Texas and was appointed Assistant Attorney General for the State of Texas and assigned to the Law Enforcement Defense Division in Austin, Texas. During his tenure as Assistant Attorney General, Lee routinely appeared in federal courts across the State of Texas on behalf of various state law enforcement agencies.
