Overview

Traditionally, ranch life called for all of the ranch hands working for an outfit to dedicate themselves to the brand, in other words, the marking of the ranch where they were employed, by working as hard as they could to help the ranch succeed. Cowboys worked from sunup to sundown, come snow, rain, sleet, hail, or blistering sun. From day to day cowboys could be on horseback pushing cattle, down on the ground fixing fences, or in the corrals branding and working cattle.
