#### **General Information**

(Please read before registering) you may not register for this program if you are a full-time law enforcement officer, prosecutor, or currently acting as a prosecutor or special prosecutor in a capital case (unfortunately, no exceptions).

Registration Fees: Pre-registration fees for CDLP events total \$40. Of that amount, \$5 is collected as tuition for attending a grant-funded training event.
